Public Health & Safety

1. **BPD Action Committee** – BP reported that the Action Committee is reviewing the BPD Community Policing Plan. CJO expressed concern about the impact this may have on Seton Hill, which is formulating its own Public Safety Action Plan, and asked if the community will have the opportunity to review. (Update: this is an internal BPD document, not intended for broad review.)
2. **Behavioral Health Action Committee** – DS reported that G.R.O.W. has moved into the BEAM space at 7-9 N. Eutaw. G.R.O.W. works on _____. GB reported that she is going to distribute additional Here 2 Help hotline postcards with Nick Usher from DPOB.
3. **Transit Action Committee** – PSH reported on the December meeting with MTA Administrator Kevin Quinn and DOT Director Steve Sharkey. At this meeting, we got on the same page and agreed to work together on safety and beautification, begin a broader conversation about placemaking. Discussed the fact that the BPD Action Plan lists MTA as a partner, and it is important to make sure that this relationship works.

Partner Connections – S. Stokes reported that she is working to arrange a meeting with the SAO.

Appearance & Cleanliness – AW reported that the decals have been ordered. As soon as we deliver the trash cans delivered to the businesses on the 300 block of Park Avenue, we will work with the City to ensure that businesses and residents understand the regulations regarding trash and recycling. If necessary, the city will then begin enforcement actions.
